

## Health Certificate Check List

We get our health certificates through the “Nevada Department of Agriculture”. These certificates are used within all the states, and Canada, except for Hawaii. *If you are going out of the country, you will need to look up specifications based on the country you are traveling to.*

- We will need the following information:
  - Address as to where the pet is going (example, Hotel, Home, Boarding Facility, Camp Site) and a departing local address.
  - All pets receiving a health certificate must be current on rabies if they are 12 weeks of age or older. If the patient did not have a rabies vaccine at North Hills Veterinary Clinic then we will need to either issue a new one or have a current rabies certificate brought to the appointment for the health certificate.
  - Owners Name
  - Owners Street Address, City, State and Zip Code
  - Name of Pet
  - Microchip number (when applicable)
  - Breed of Pet
  - Sex of Pet
  - Is the pet Spayed or Neutered?
  - Age of Pet
- We can fit up to 3 pets on one certificate and the office charge will be charged per pet.
- The pet(s) MUST be present for the exam at the time the certificate is written.
- You will receive 2 copies of the Health Certificate today. Please take these forms and the current Rabies certificate with you when you travel.
- We will mail in the appropriate paperwork to the NV Dept of Agriculture

**A current Health Certificate is usually required anytime an animal crosses state lines. Check with your airline prior to your certificate as they do have varying requirements for health certificates. We always recommend them.**
